## SOCCER IN THE U.S. - THE NEXT STEPS

INTERACTIVE, MULTI-PLATFORM TOWN HALL MEETING,  
LIVE FROM 2012 NSCAA CONVENTION IN K.C. ON JAN. 11

Numerous hot-button issues are expected to be tackled, including game development from the youth ranks up to the national team; the future of the U.S. Men's National Team; Major League Soccer expansion; the state of Women's Professional Soccer; the U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy and its coexistence with club and high school soccer; and developing America's next-generation soccer stars.
